When crossing the Chesapeake Bay Bridge from Annapolis, one can catch a glimpse of what sets Queen Anne's County apart from other counties on the Eastern Shore. Known as the "The Gateway to the Eastern Shore," the county's status as a member of the Baltimore-Washington, D.C. Metropolitan Statistical Area is pleasantly complemented by its rural charm and rich history.

In 1706, Queen Anne's County was carved from the counties of Talbot and Kent and included the Isle of Kent. Kent Island is one of the first English settlements in America. In 1631, a trading post was established on Kent Island by William Claiborne - three years before Lord Baltimore landed at St. Mary's in 1634. A bitter controversy lasting years raged between Lord Baltimore and William Claiborne over the possession of Kent Island, the largest of all the islands in the Chesapeake Bay.

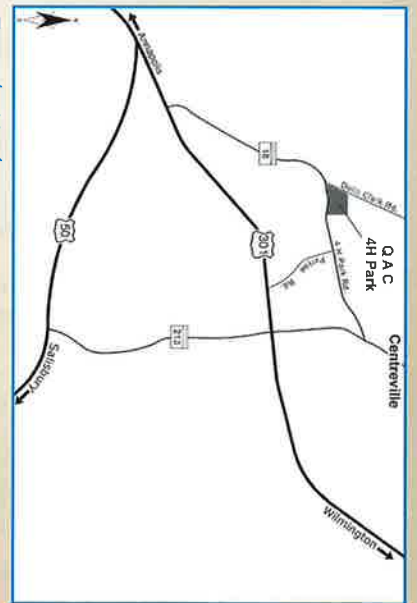
Centreville, the county seat, is home to the oldest courthouse (c. 1791) in continuous use in the State Maryland. A statue of Queen Anne, dedicated by Princess Anne of England in 1977, sits regally on the courthouse green gazing out on the many fine examples of early American structure still in use and are typical of the homes and buildings in our historic towns and countryside.

While you are here, we invite you to enjoy the bounty of Queen Anne's County, the breadbasket of Maryland. Watermen carry on the proud tradition of providing fresh seafood to restaurants and markets across the region. Our farms, a growing number of which are chicken farms, lead the state in production of corn, wheat and soybeans that support the production of feed for Delmarva's chicken industry.

We are proud that the Delmarva Chicken Festival is being held at the Queen Anne's County 4-H Park, home of our County Fair held every August. We invite you to come back to enjoy an old fashioned County Fair.

Your visit to Queen Anne's County would not be complete if you did not explore our many quaint towns and villages and enjoy our working landscapes via the Chesapeake Bay Scenic By- Way.

**From the North:**  
 Take Rt. 301 South and turn right on Perlee Road. Go to stop sign and turn left on Rt. 18. Turn right on Dulin Clark Road. The 4-H Park is on the right.

**From the East:**  
 Take Rt. 404 to Rt. 50 West. Go west on Rt. 50 to Rt. 213 North. Turn onto Rt. 213 North and go about 5 miles. Turn left on Rt. 18 and go 3 miles. Turn right on Dulin Clark Road. The 4-H Park is on the right.

**From the South:**  
 Take Rt. 50 West to Rt. 213 North. Go 5 miles and turn left on Rt. 18. Go 3 miles and turn right on Dulin Clark Road. The 4-H Park is on the right.

**From the West:**  
 Take Rt. 50/301 East across the Bay Bridge. Stay on Rt. 301 North (go left at the 50/301 split) for approximately 2 miles and turn left on Rt. 18. Go 4 miles and turn left on Dulin Clark Road. The 4-H Park is on the right.
